## Yearly Payments

After a little confusion last month, the Committee has made the following three criteria necessary to obtain the one month FREE site fees:

- 1) Yearly payments will only accepted between January and March each year. Although this year we will allow payments this month also.
- 2) Eleven months fees must be paid, regardless of any cancellations throughout the year that Stallholders may already be aware of.
- 3) Only one cancellation will be credited, which will be added at end of year paid for. Cancellations must be advised before noon Friday before the day.

## Stalls encroaching in Walkways

Last month it was noted that numerous stallholders (in fact too many too speak with) were creeping out into to walkway areas with signage, racks, displays etc. Please remember our Term & Condition No 12: ***“Stallholders are required to keep their goods within their allocated areas. Sandwich boards or display structures must not be placed in the walkways.”***

Not only is this a safety issue, but this rule is also so that our markets are fair to all Stallholders.

## Our Insurance Policy Says:

*“...Furthermore it is important to note that no indemnity is extended under the QCPCA Liability Insurance Policy for the legal liabilities attaching to the participating stallholders arising from the negligence of the stallholders or from their activities and products. These parties are to carry and maintain their own Public and Products Liability Insurance to protect their liabilities.”*
