### FROM THE COMMITTEE

Last month a stallholder advised that there was excessive noise on the market grounds behind the Motel from around 4.30 am. Although no-one from the Motel formally complained, we take this opportunity to remind stallholders of our Term and Condition number: *11. Stallholders (particularly those near the Motel) are required to dim their lights and not make undue noise when setting up for the market. Violation of noise provisions will risk a fine under the Tablelands Regional Council's Noise Abatement Act.* Please be considerate of our neighbours early on Market mornings.

The Committee wishes to acknowledge Leonardo from Café Crema (site N1 in the middle) and his generous contribution to our P&C for the free coffees he provides to our volunteer Money Collectors, as thanks for their contribution. Cheers Leonardo, we really appreciate it and wish you well in your 'new' venture.

Finally, some of you will receive the new red newsletter stationery today and we encourage you to support the eight businesses who continue to support us with advertising, several of them for many years now.

### F ROW TO GAZEBOS

Firstly, there seems to be some misconception that *all* table stalls will be removed. However, as stated last month, the Committee are committed to removing *F row table* sites only, from *November* 2010. Notices were delivered to F row table occupants in May, advising of this and some discussion was held with a few long term stallholders, regarding car parks and a possible compromise.

The Market Sub-Committee has since held further deliberation and has agreed that: **from November 2010 those F row stallholders who still require a table set up will be moved to either B or C row, which do not have a carpark available on site.**

Whilst we are aware that this is at odds for some of those F row table stallholders, the Committee feel that it is imperative to take this step for the safety of both stallholders and P&C volunteers alike.

### STALLHOLDERS UPDATE

For June we farewell one permanent stallholder: K33 Gabbi who has moved to Townsville. Her spot has been taken by Werner from K32 for his fruit & veg, who has long been waiting on a second site. There were also several stalls cancelled due to the third No Show: 5 tables C1 Kat, C2 Fee, C13&14 Donna, C18 Melissa, and 2 gazebos E10 Laurel & Mimi and J40 Dominic & Elvi. These spots will be snapped up this month and we will keep an eye on the other no shows

This month we welcome seven new permanent stallholders: D12 & E12 Alan Kroh and Maria Neilan with Heat Packs & Gutter Protection, E9 Jack's Massage, J38 Anj's plants, J37 Annie & Rob from Coffee Works, N4 Andy & Heather with Bungy Balls and Table sites: C1&2 Karen Winlaw's kids books and C10 Sunny's seed jewellery.

### WALKWAY AT KINDY END

Whilst we welcome new stallholders at J37 and J38, down under the trees in the bottom corner of the Market grounds, at front of the Kindy fence and Elm Street, we hope that this will resolve a bit of an ongoing problem. Last month the issue of a walkway at the Kindy/Elm St end was again raised, so Annie, Rob and their boys from Coffee Works at J38 have agreed to set up to the left side of the site marker, leaving a space between them and the tree for customer access. It will also be necessary for other stallholders parking in that corner to bear this in mind, to leave an alley way for access. It has been suggested that we rope this area off, however this is not practical with vehicle access, so hopefully this will help.

### FOOD LICENCES

A reminder for those of you who missed last month: we have altered our Terms & Conditions (no. 14) to read "display", as follows: *All stallholders selling food must display a current Food Licence from their City/Regional council, as well as the relevant Food Safety Supervisor details.....*

Unfortunately several casuals were turned away, as we had allocated for six stallholders to just turn up on market morning, but not expecting to have so many vacant spaces. ### INFORMATION BOOTH

We really appreciate stallholder's feedback and last month Louise suggested a permanent stallholders list and site map, to assist with giving directions and product knowledge. We have these documents available at the P&C Information Booth and we also hand out verbal directions to patrons and stallholders each Market morning. The Info Booth is always manned with a local volunteer, who can contact Jane via two way radio if they can't find the answer to a query. Stallholders are welcome to collect a copy of the site map from us, although we don't keep huge numbers on hand, we can make a note and bring one for you next month. The product list is a little more tricky, with stallholders changing from month to month, it is probably best to check with the Info Booth, as they will know who has cancelled or where casual stallholders can be located. We also find that some stallholders have so many different types of goods available, it is hard to keep track of who has what, although we do try hard, things change quickly and often, so come and see us at the ramp.
